ANNOUNCEMENT ON REOPENING OF PCM CENTRE IN QUETTA AS OF THURSDAY 25 JUNE 2009

The Commission rate for Afghan Refugees (CAR) and National Database and Registration Authority's (NADRA) Proof of Registration Card Modification Centre for registered Afghans in Quetta is reopening on Thursday 25 June 2009.

Afghans are reminded that the Proof of Registration Card Modification (PCM) centre is for registered Afghans who already received their Proof of Registration (PoR) cards during the registration exercise of October 2006 – February 2007, and that this is not a new registration

Afghans can register newborn babies born to registered families, correct, modify or get new PoR cards for children who have reached the age of five (the eligibility age for a PoR card) and replace lost or stolen cards at the PCM centre.



Possible updates or modifications include correcting mistakes in the spelling of names, dates of birth, new marriages and newborn babies. Damaged, stolen and lost cards can be replaced. Each modification will cost 55 Pakistani rupees.

All updates or modifications in the PoR card can take place only if a valid reference document is provided such as birth certificate, Basic Health Unit card, Expanded Program on Vaccination or other vaccination card, school certificate, driving license, passport, and refugee camp card or marriage certificate. In case of stolen or lost cards, applicants are required to produce copy of 'roz namcha' issued or attestation letter from the nearest police station.

PCM will remain open from Mondays to Saturdays starting from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m daily.
