

**HIGHLIGHTS**

**Refugee Operation**

- **1.7 m (1,706,167)** Afghan & **688** non-Afghan refugees in Pakistan
- **968,861** Afghans settled in refugee villages in KPK
- **1,148,526** urban-based Afghan refugees
- **1,757 Afghans** returned home since 1 March 2011; nearly **110,000** returned in 2010; **3.7m** have returned since 2002
- **Proof of Registration** card legalises stay of Afghans in Pakistan

**IDP Operation (Internally Displaced Persons)**

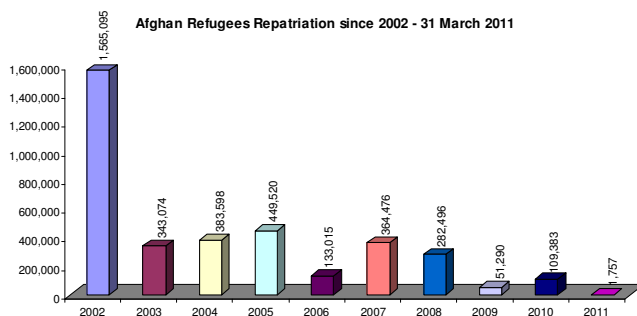
- Approx. **152,067 IDPs** receive UNHCR assistance
- **38,078 Flood-IDPs** (Sindh Province)
- **15,352 Flood-IDPs** (Baluchistan Province)
- Approx. **98,637 Conflict-IDPs** in camps (approx. **1 m (952,035)** live outside camps [KPK 31.12.10])

**IMPORTANT FACTS**

- Pakistan hosts the world's largest refugee population (1.7 m). Country is also prone to recurrent natural disasters
- Pakistan is not a party to the **1951 Geneva Convention** relating to the Status of Refugees and its **1967 Protocol**
- Pakistan does not have national refugee legislation and Refugee Status Determination (RSD) mechanisms in place
- Pakistan generally accepts UNHCR decisions on RSD and allows asylum seekers as well as recognized refugees to remain in Pakistan until a lasting solution is found
- UNHCR persons of concern include Afghan (mainly non-POR card holders), non-Afghan asylum seekers and refugees

Voluntary returns; Profiling & [re]registration; resettlement & local integration; RSD; advocacy for accession to 1951 Refugee Convention & the creation of national legal framework; community services; training & advocacy programs for sexual violence against women; legal aid programs; livelihood coping mechanisms; emergency response; UNHCR is lead agency for protection, CCCM, Shelter & NFIs.
