About this report

All figures in this report refer to registered Afghans who repatriated to Afghanistan from Pakistan through UNHCR's assisted voluntary repatriation program from 1 April to 31 July 2009. The return of Afghans from Pakistan has been UNHCR's largest voluntary repatriation operation in the world. Since 2002 a total of 3,572,564 Afghans have returned home with UNHCR assistance.

The breakdown of assisted voluntary repatriation figures from Pakistan since 2002 is as follows: in 2008 (starting 1 March) a total of 282,496 Afghans repatriated to Afghanistan. In 2007, a total of 364,476 Afghans returned with UNHCR assistance. Of these 206,128¹ were assisted to return home during the 'grace period', a six-week deadline from 1 March - 15 April reserved as a last window of opportunity for unregistered Afghans, not holding a Proof of Registration (POR) card, to return to their country with UNHCR assistance. The same year, another 159,535 registered Afghans returned home between 16 April and 31 October 2007. In 2006, 133,015 Afghans returned to Afghanistan; in 2005 the figure was 449,520; in 2004, 383,598 and in 2003, 343,074 Afghans repatriated with the help of the UN Refugee Agency. UNHCR registered a record 1.56 million returns (excluding the spontaneous or un-assisted returns) in 2002.

There are at present 1.72 million registered Afghans remaining in Pakistan. All unregistered Afghans are considered as illegal immigrants by the Government of Pakistan (GoP) and are subject to the laws of the land. UNHCR has negotiated with the GoP so that all Afghans (with or without a POR card) with a legitimate need for protection will continue to have access to UNHCR on an individual basis and will be processed accordingly.

To be eligible for assisted repatriation and to receive the cash grant offered by UNHCR, registered Afghans must approach one of the UNHCR Voluntary Repatriation Centers (VRCs) - Hayatabad in Peshawar (NWFP) or Baleli near Quetta (Balochistan) and successfully complete various steps including deregistration by NADRA (National Database and Registration Authority), physical invalidation of the POR card (by cutting the corner of the POR card), Iris recognition ('IRIS sticker' is issued) to ensure that the person has not received UNHCR assistance before, the issuance of a Voluntary Repatriation Form (VRF) for each family and a medical check. Returnees may also refer to the Protection Clinic on the VRC premises should they have legal queries.

Returnees receive their cash grant at the designated Encashment Center (EC) upon arrival in Afghanistan. The cash grant of, on average, \$100 per person as of 2007 is a threefold increase from prior years and was requested by the GoP and agreed upon during the meeting of the Tripartite Commission. The exact amount of the grant varies according to distance to the final destination and is intended to help cover the cost of transportation and to provide reintegration assistance upon return to Afghanistan.

The security situation in Pakistan deteriorated dramatically during 2009. The UN suffered the killing of 12 of its staff members in Pakistan, 3 of them from UNHCR. In addition one UNHCR staff member was kidnapped and released after two months. GOP operations in Swat, Buner and the Federally-Administered Tribal Areas (FATA) resulted in the mass and rapid displacement of over two million people from these areas to points in the North West Frontier Province (NWFP) and beyond. This large-scale displacement of populations exacerbated the social, economic and security situation of the 'hosting' areas, in particular Peshawar and its surrounding areas. In addition, numerous blasts and suicide attacks against GOP staff and installations throughout the country caused the disruption of many activities including UNHCR repatriation operations and the suspension of activities at the VRCs (Baleli in Balochistan and Hayatabad in Peshawar). The 2009 repatriation season began on 1 April and was suspended at the end of July 2009. No further UNHCR assisted repatriation took place in 2009.

Summary of Repatriation Trends (April - July 2009)

A total of 10,138 Afghan families or 51,290 individuals repatriated to Afghanistan with UNHCR assistance in 2009.

Returns by province of registration in Pakistan

- From 01 April to 31 July 2009: 56% of the repatriating Afghans in Pakistan returned from NWFP, 9% from Sindh, 13% from Punjab & Islamabad and 21% from Balochistan.

¹ The more updated figure for the return of Afghans without a POR card in 2007 is 204,941. Numbers continue to be revised as new data comes to light.

- The total number of Afghan returnees from 01 April 2009 to 31 July 2009 is 51,290 (this figure includes recyclers who were processed but failed the IRIS verification/recognition test and did not receive assistance from UNHCR, c. 1,727 individuals - see page 9)

Returns from refugee villages (RVs) vs. non-RVs

From 1 April - 31 July 2009, 30% of Afghan returnees were from a refugee village (RV) in Pakistan and 70% from outside RVs. In 2007 (as of 16 April), 57% of Afghans repatriated from RVs, 43% repatriated from outside these sites. During the 2007 grace period (1 March-15 April), 6% of the Afghans returned from RVs while 94% were from outside RVs (urban areas). In 2006, 30% of total returns were from RVs; in 2005 46%, in 2004 43% and in 2003, 31% of repatriates were former RV residents in Pakistan. In 2004 and 2005, the percentage of returns from RVs increased due to the fact that UNHCR and the GoP announced the closure of Rs in the FATA area near the Afghan border.

Ethnicity

- Some 73% Pashtuns and 11% Tajiks have repatriated from 01 April - 31 July 2009. In 2007 81.5% of the registered Afghans who repatriated were Pashtun and 9% were Tajik; during the grace period, 95% of returnees (non-POR card holders) were ethnic Pashtuns and 3 % were Tajiks.
- Pashtuns made up 23% of Afghans who repatriated to Nangarhar (2009), 13% of returns to Kabul, 11% of those who went back to Kunduz and 6% of those going back to Paktya. While Tajiks made up 11% of Afghans going to Nangarhar, 35% of returnees to Kabul, 14% of Afghans going to Kunduz, 6% of those repatriating to Parwan and 12% of the population going to Baghlan from Pakistan.

Returns by area of origin and final destination in Afghanistan

- The majority of returnees or 19% of Afghan who returned in 2009 went back to Nangarhar province, 14% returned to Kabul, 11% returned to Kunduz, 6% went back to Jawzjan and 5% to Kunar.

Education

- 2% of the returning Afghans had completed primary, and 1.2% secondary education.

IRIS Verification

The Iris scanning and verification system was introduced in 2003. Initially it was for all returnees above the age of 12 years but later reviewed and reduced to those 5 years of age and above. Children below 5 years of age are not scanned due to the difficulty in getting them to focus on the scanning lense for the desired period of time. The Iris test is to ensure that the system is not abused and that 'recyclers' are identified and barred from receiving repatriation assistance more than once. The ratio of persons recognized at the Iris scanning stage i.e. rejected for repatriation by the Iris Recognition Database during the reporting period, is 3%. 79% of the Afghans who approached the VRCs were successfully enrolled; this excludes children under 5 years of age and those who did not undergo the IRIS test (due to disability, etc.). The age limit for the Iris recognition test was lowered from 12 to 5 years in July 2003.

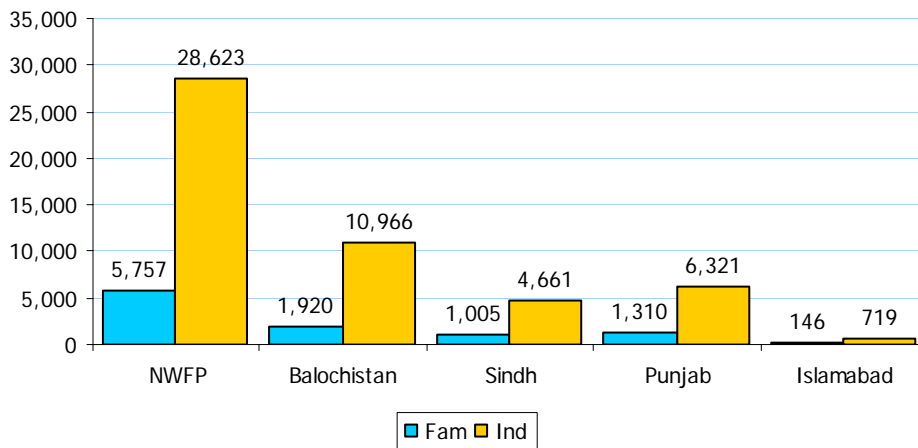
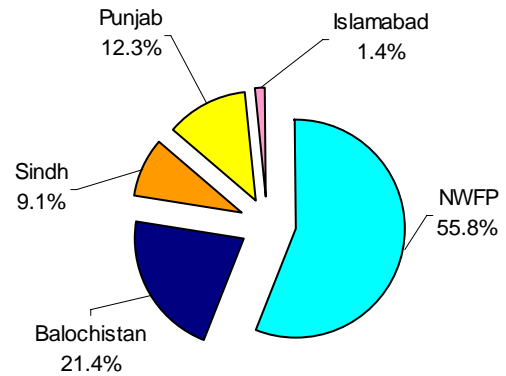
Note about the statistics

The figures in this report may appear different to those in the Daily Repatriation Reports. This is because repatriation data is collected manually in the field, submitted to respected sub-offices (Quetta / Peshawar) at the end of each day, then transferred to Branch Office Islamabad where all data is compiled and final reports are generated. There is a margin of error and a time delay in the processing so that while daily statistics may indicate one figure, the overall figures may reflect another.

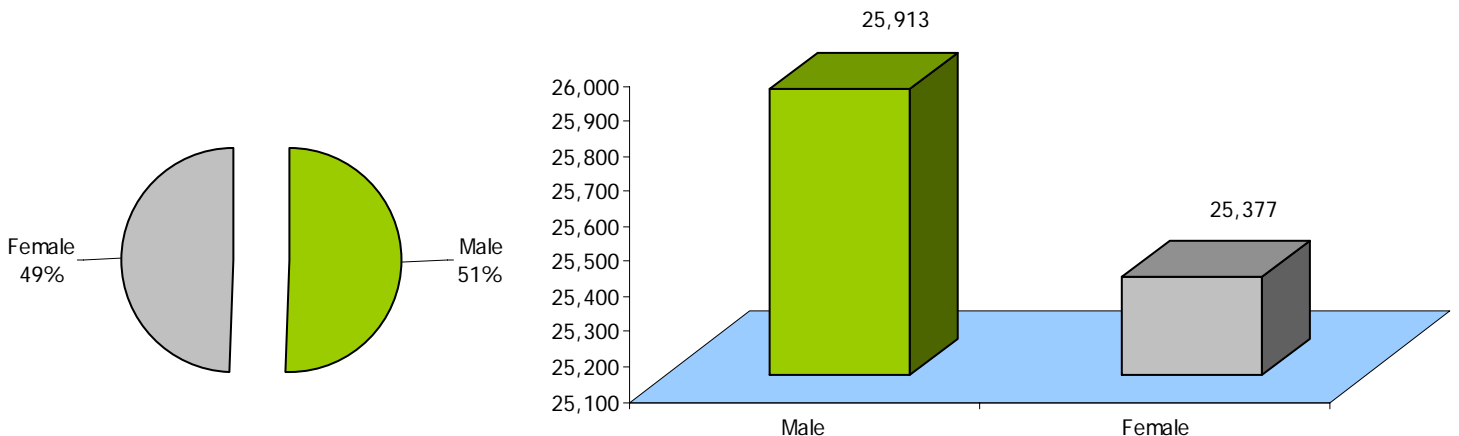

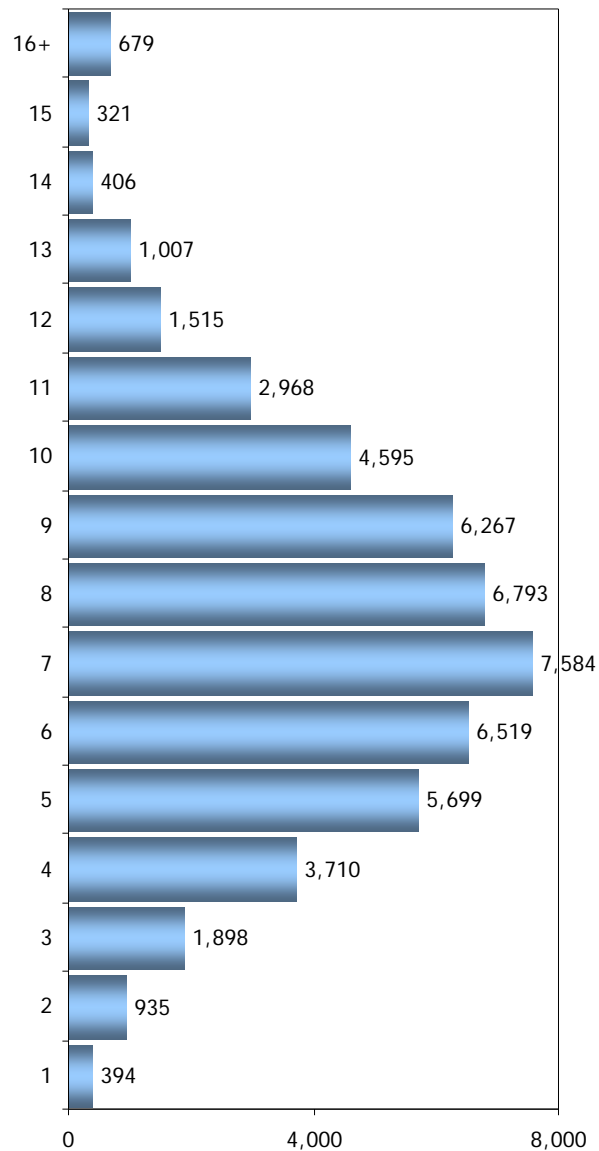

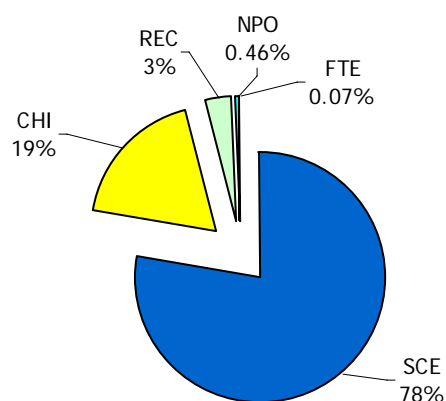

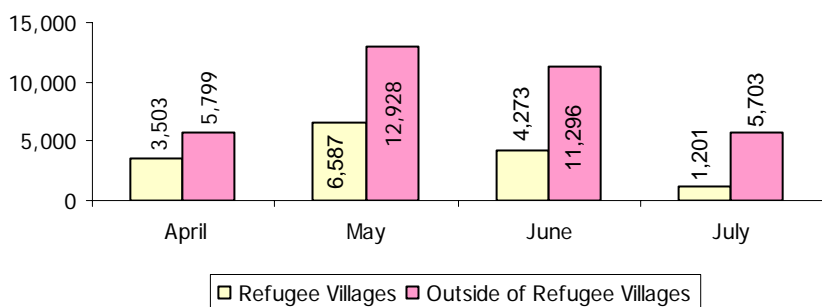

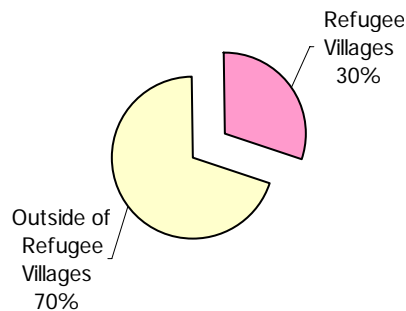

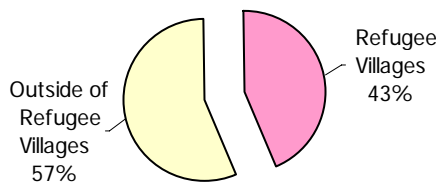
2009 RVs vs. Outside of RVs



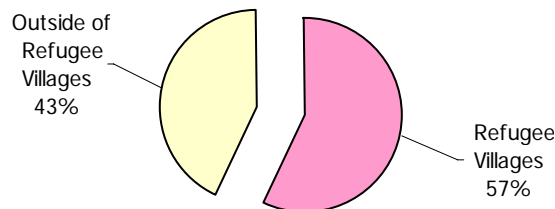
2009 RVs vs. Outside of RVs



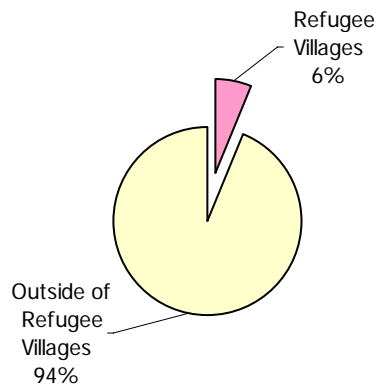
2008 RVs vs. Outside of RVs



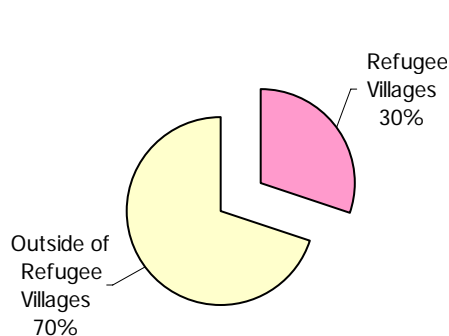
2007 RVs vs. Outside of RVs

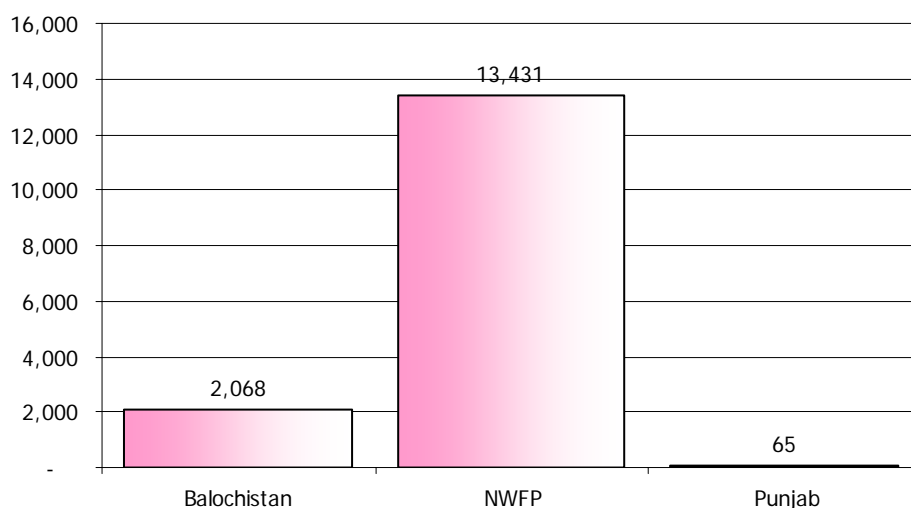

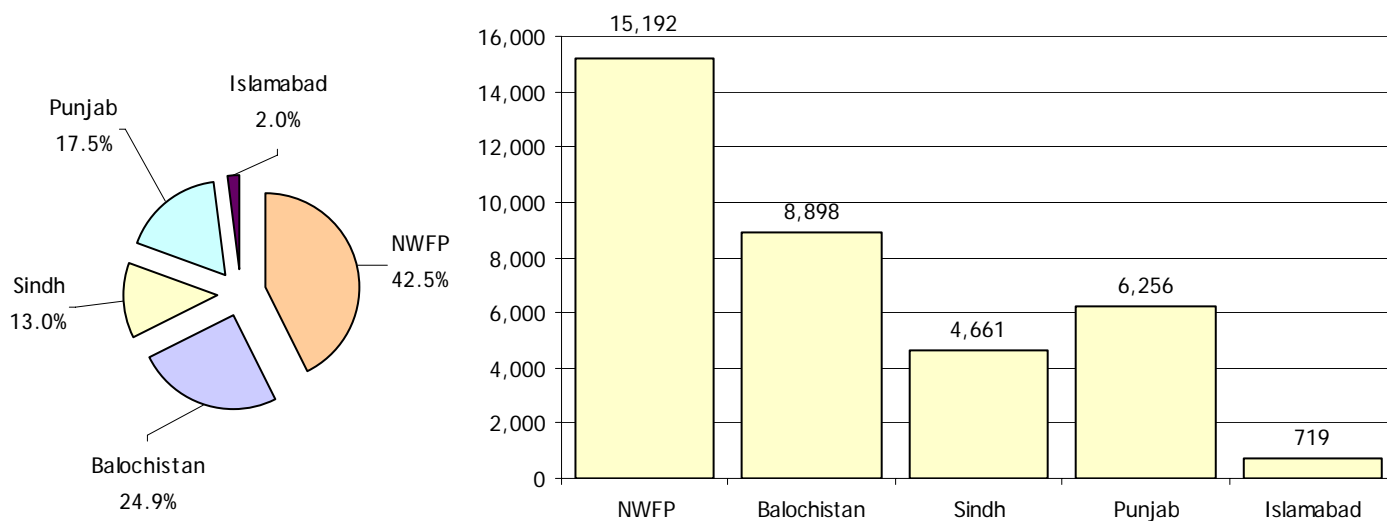

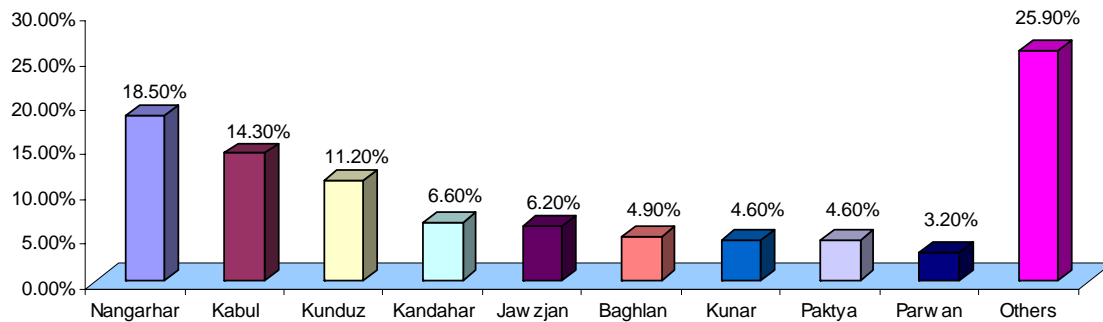

ETHNICITY AND PROVINCE OF FINAL DESTINATION

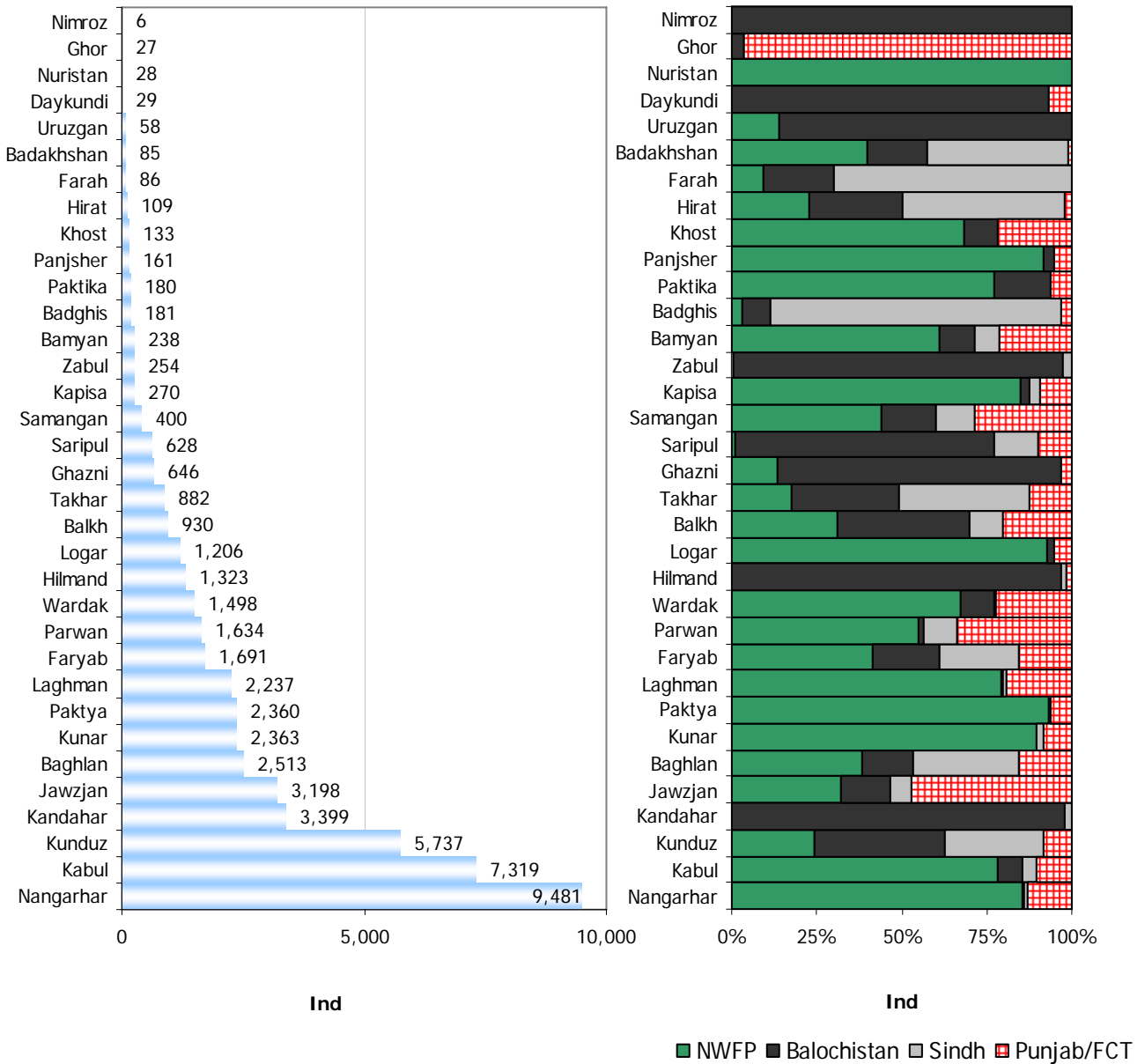

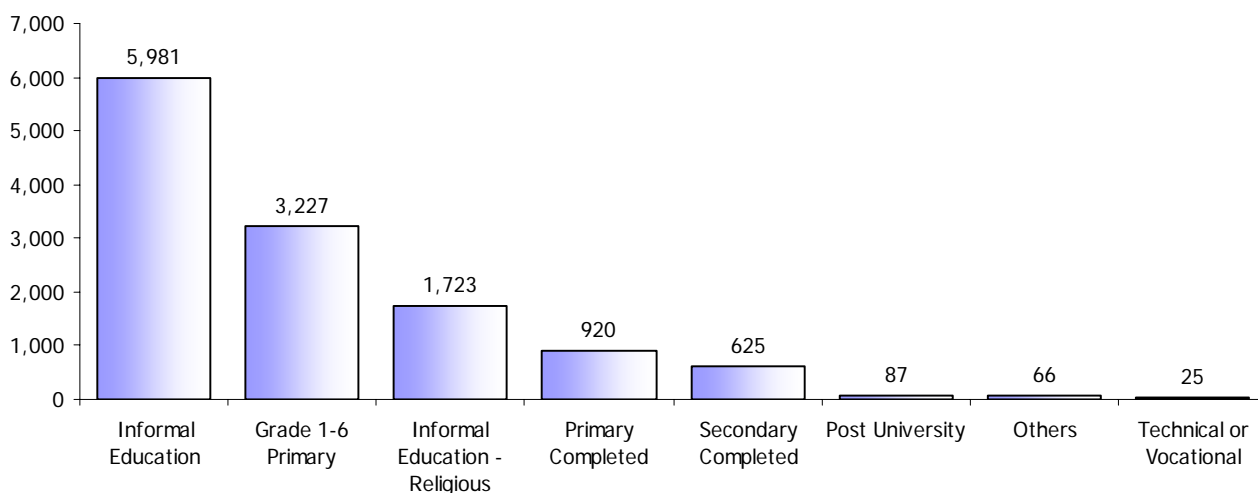
PROVINCE OF RESIDENCE AND INTENDED FINAL DESTINATION



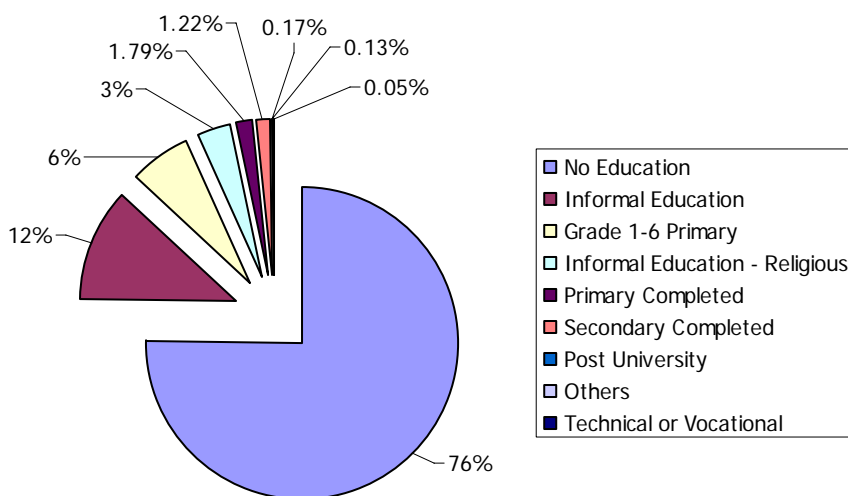
